



This fibre art weaving is made from felt, cattails, horse tails and silk woven on weft made of willow branches set into a 2 X 4 s.

The length is about 6 feet from left to right

Shibori hangs on the wall to the right Some of the smaller weavings of the students are integrated into this larger weaving A B C





THESE RED SCULPTURES ARE IN A GLASS CASE AND SO REFLECTION IS A PROBLEM AND RESULTS ARE EQUALLY IMPACTED BY REFLECTIONS.

THE DRIFTWOOD STUMP REPRESENTS THE NESTING PLATFORM WHERE THE CHILDREN SAW THE OSPREY AT BRANDT'S CREEK PARK ROTARY MARSH DOWNTOWN AND WERE CREAT3ED BY THE CASORSO CLASS .
